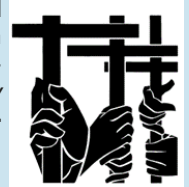

The STREAM program continues to engage and challenge our students! Kindergarten and first grade wrapped up their first STREAM experience with the study of winter weather and snowflakes. They learned that each snowflake begins as a hexagon and gradually grows six arms from each of the hexagon's points. Fourth and fifth grade students participated in a challenge where students had to design a basket and parachute that would transport a paper Santa safely to the ground. Sixth grade students have been using our Chromebooks to research our subscription box competitors. They are creating a presentation based on their research for our class company. In the upcoming weeks, students will use the information from our research to design and test STEM subscription box activities. Seventh and eighth grades completed their tiny house structures and began learning about electricity and simple circuits.
