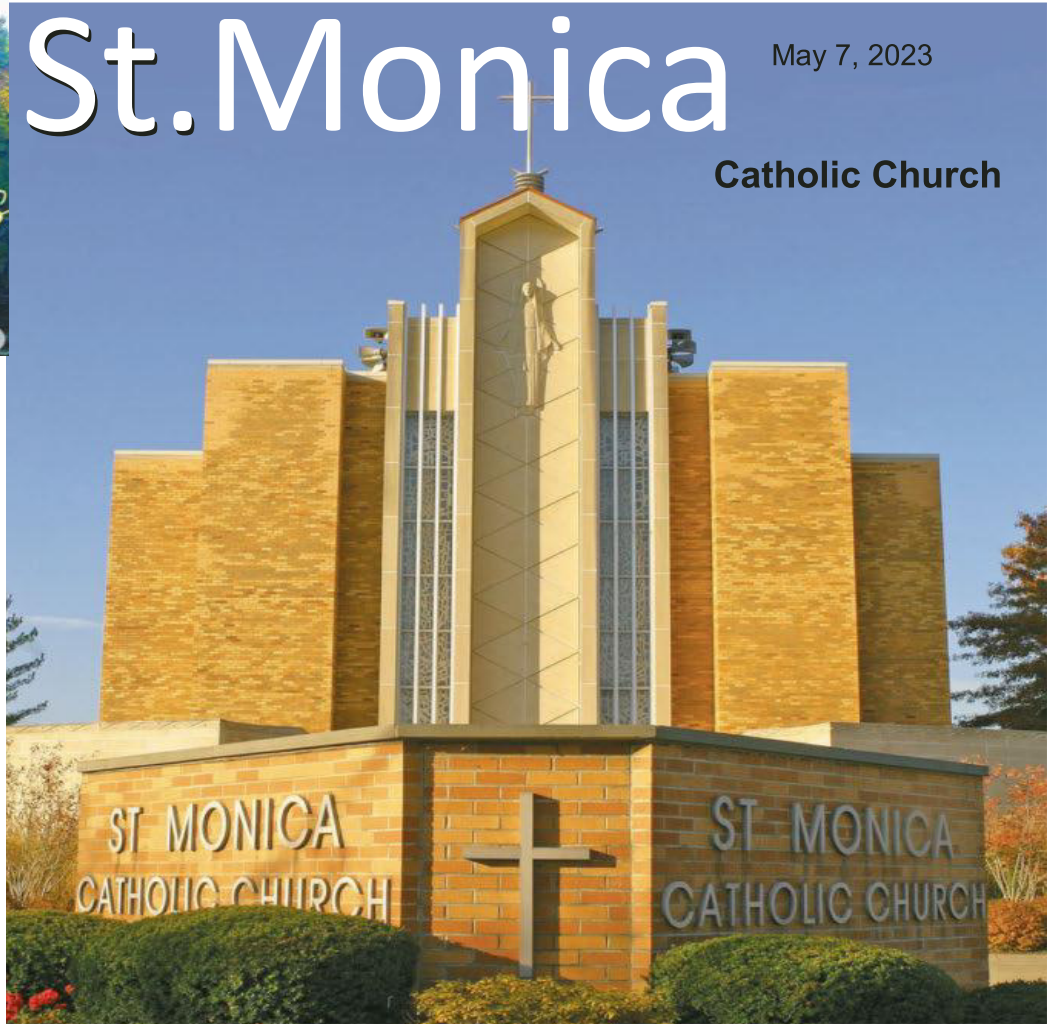

The First of Many More

Our first introduction to a food we have never tasted, or performing an action in which we never participated, or a privilege we have looked forward to for a long time usually remains in our memory. Despite not remembering all the names of the people who joined us, we most often can describe the effect the 'first' had on us. Even if others can describe what they experienced, the event does not become 'real' for us until we do it for ourselves.

Experiencing a 'first' is especially true for the ten children who are celebrating their First Holy Communion today. I am so blest to have prepared them for their initial encounter with Jesus Christ in the Eucharist. All the study and practice of the responses and gestures becomes real today as they approach the altar to cradle the sacred host in their hands and then consume it.

Preparing the first communicants for this day (and hopefully, for their Confirmation in four years) is truly a joy! Being able to teach them, and watch as God works in the hearts and lives of these First Communicants is one of the most fantastic benefits of being their teacher. I am probably as excited as they are about the privilege of meeting Jesus for the first time, and I look forward to seeing them continue those 'meetings' at the school Masses, as well as on weekends.

Attending a First Communion Mass is a wonderful time to reflect on **your First Communion celebration**. You probably knelt at the communion rail to receive your First Communion and maintained a full fast (with no water) before that 'first' reception occurred. I know that I did, because all the faucets in our home were covered! I don't think that my mom or dad had any water or coffee to drink either. Depending upon age, you may have only been required to fast from food or drink for an hour before actual reception!

Please keep the First Communicants and their families in your prayers. Keeping children Catholic in today's world is not the easiest task! Please feel free to congratulate the Communicants and their families. They, and I will appreciate your kindness greatly!

There will be one First Communicant at the 9:00 am Mass, and nine First Communicants at the 10:45 am Mass.

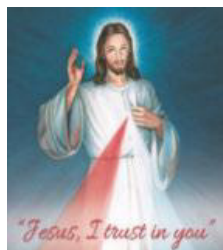

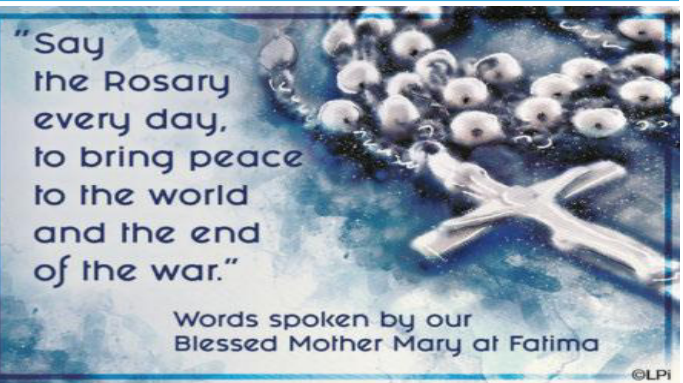

**FIRST READING** Acts 6:1-7

As the number of disciples continued to grow, the Hellenists complained against the Hebrews because their widows were being neglected in the daily distribution. So the Twelve called together the community of the disciples and said, "It is not right for us to neglect the word of God to serve at table. Brothers, select from among you seven reputable men, filled with the Spirit and wisdom, whom we shall appoint to this task, whereas we shall devote ourselves to prayer and to the ministry of the word." The proposal was acceptable to the whole community, so they chose Stephen, a man filled with faith and the Holy Spirit, also Philip, Prochorus, Nicanor, Timon, Parmenas, and Nicholas of Antioch, a convert to Judaism. They presented these men to the apostle who prayed and laid hands on them. The word of God continued to spread, and the number of the disciples in Jerusalem increased greatly; even a large group of priests were becoming obedient to the faith.

For it says in Scripture:

*Behold, I am laying a stone in Zion,  
a cornerstone, chosen and precious,  
and whoever believes in it shall not be put to shame.*

Therefore, its value is for you who have faith, but for those without faith:

*The stone that the builders rejected  
has become the cornerstone, and  
A stone that will make people stumble,  
and a rock that will make them fall.*

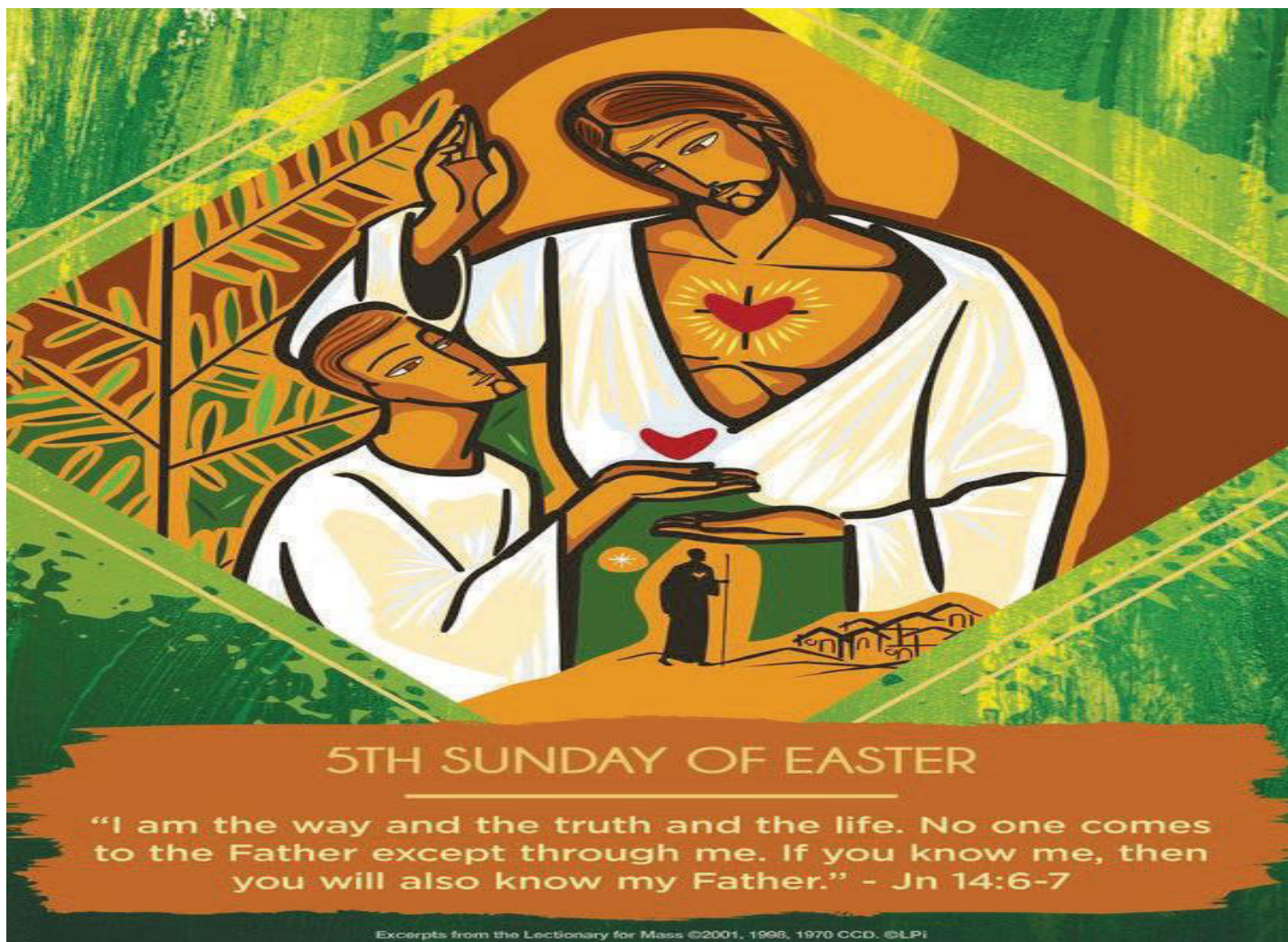
They stumble by disobeying the word, as is their destiny.

You are "a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, a people of his own, so that you may announce the praises" of him who called you out of darkness into his wonderful light.

**GOSPEL** John 14:1-12

Jesus said to his disciples: "Do not let your hearts be troubled. You have faith in God; have faith also in me. In my Father's house there are many dwelling places. If there were not, would I have told you that I am going to prepare a place for you? And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come back again and take you to myself, so that where I am you also may be. Where I am going you know the way." Thomas said to him, "Master, we do not know where you are going; how can we know the way?" Jesus said to him, I am the way and the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me. If you know me, then you will also know my Father. From now on you do know him and have seen him." Philip said to him, "Master, show us the Father, and that will be enough for us." Jesus said to him, "Have I been with you for so long a time and you still do not know me, Philip? Whoever has seen me has seen the Father. How can you say, 'Show us the Father'? Do you not believe that I am in the Father and the Father is in me? The words that I speak to you I do not speak on my own. The Father who dwells in me is doing his works. Believe me that I am in the Father and the Father is in me, or else, believe because of the works themselves.
