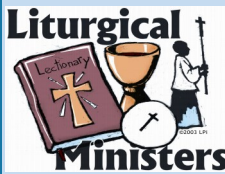

Pastoral Scene

NEIGHBORS

Ever think about who your neighbor is or what kind of neighbor you are. Most of us think our neighbor is the one who lives next door or the homes nearby to yours. At times we are good neighbors and sometimes we are not so good neighbors.

Let me share what I tell couples on their wedding day during the homily. I tell them that you're not only going to be husband and wife, but that you're going to be neighbors. Very close neighbors. I tell them to be good neighbors to each other as well as good spouses. I also explain to them that the people who witness their marriage ceremony are also your neighbors (family and friends). In reality, we are neighbors with everyone in the world.

God made us each with different personalities, to think on our own and because of this some don't seem to be very good neighbors. We see this throughout the world, people against people and country against country.

Most of us see this when one steals a parking place, cutting in front of the line, talking in the movie theater, road rage, taking someone's seat in the theater, Church, or any kind of social event. I could go on and on, but I think you get the point. Because we are all made different, we think differently, and some try to compromise, some pout and some live with it. Some people let it go and others don't. Some let it build up inside of them and get very angry. Some threaten to leave the establishment, and some try to make something good of the situation. As we grow up and go to work; there will be things we like and dislike. Some things can be changed, and some cannot. Remember, we all cannot have our way every single time. We, as a people should know better and must learn to compromise.

Sometimes it's very hard to be good neighbors. Like some of you, I find it hard at times also. When you read in the scriptures, St. Paul writing to Corinthians tells us how to live together as a community. If we can learn to live together as a community, we also can learn to live as good neighbors. We, as Catholics, should be examples to everyone.

Jesus also gave us a new commandment: "Love one another as I love you."

Now if we can live together as a community and love one another as Jesus loves us; what kind of neighbor do you want to try to be? Think and pray about it.
