

St. Benedict Catholic School

As we complete our eleventh year, I want to personally thank Fr. Miola, Fr. Mullee, our Board members, teachers, staff, parents, parishioners, and students for their contribution in making St. Benedict Catholic School an amazing place to learn and grow in our faith! We have traveled this journey together, and all that we have accomplished would not have been possible without your prayers and support.

This year, we were able to return to precovid normalcy. Our students attended several field trips, joined several competitions at the Diocesan level, and we had our first school performance since 2019! This was the first time for many of our students to collaborate with others inside and outside of the classroom since the start of the pandemic. We are proud of our staff members for making these opportunities available to our St. Benedict students.

Our students have been able to visit the zoo, bowling, Hale Farm, Rock River Nature Center, the history and science museums and go rock climbing. Th graders toured Columbus and our 8th graders had a wonderful trip to Washington DC! Being able to experience these field trips in person have created lasting memories for our students and staff.

St. Benedict students participated in several STEM based competitions this year with great success. In March, St. Benedict co-hosted the X-STREAM Mini-Games. This is an engineering and design based competition. Our students competed in either the Lego Design challenge or the Creative Cardboard Arcade challenge.

Our first grade students participated in the first Diocean sponsored Guppy Tank with the theme of "Ideas for Good." Students worked in small groups to identify areas of need in our school or local communities. They then brainstormed solutions for making a change and positive impact to those identified areas. The projects were focusing on improving our school playground, improving our cafeteria, and hosting a book swap event to encourage reading.



Several of our eighth grade students participated in the Northeast Ohio Pitch Competition presented by the Young Entrepreneurs Institute. The pitch challenge helps students to develop creativity, problem solving, critical thinking, and presentation skills. This competition prepares students for 21st century careers as it develops their workforce readiness skills. The competitors had to develop a business plan for a product or service and then record a pitch highlighting their product or service.

Outside of these wonderful STEM based competition opportunities, our students have been growing in their knowledge and skills in the classroom through the use of project based learning and technology. In our STREAM program students had the opportunity to use tools like BeeBot Robots, Sphero Robots, Bloxels Video Game Design, BreakoutEdu, Snap Circuits, 3D pens, Play Doh Touch, MakeyMakey, Make-Do and so much more! We look forward to participating in more STEM based competitions next year and continuing to prepare our students for their future careers!

As we look towards the 2023-2024 school year, several exciting projects will take place this summer. Our school library will be transformed to an exciting, cozy, and inviting reading environment. Our teachers will have the opportunity to bring their classes to this newly redesigned space to encourage and develop a love of reading.

An additional project in the building will take place in the Augustine Room found in the lower level of the main campus. This area will become a new and remodeled STEM classroom with a makerspace. This space will be utilized by our STEM and classroom teachers. Having this space available will allow for our students to use their creativity and imagination to work on projects that could lead to future competitions.

St. Benedict Early Learning Center and Daycare ended the school year strong! We started our school year with the theme of Kindness Counts, where students and staff were encouraged to be caught being kind. Kindness surely did overtake the Early Learning Center with 377 acts of kindness by the end of the year. We found that kindness was contagious and very habit forming. Congratulations and continue to show your kindness to others.

May also means graduations and transitions to new programs. We have 44 kindergarten students participating in graduation this year! 32 preschool students are either transitioning to our preschool two program or kindergarten in the fall. Our infants are growing by leaps and bounds by making the jump to our toddler program. It is amazing to see how much growth academically, socially, and physically happens with St. Benedict's littlest eagles throughout the school year. We are proud of our teachers and staff for making the Early Learning Center a nurturing environment for our students and families.

We look forward to continuing on our journey together as we grow in God's goodness and love.


