

Pastoral Scene

What's In Your Basket?

This line may sound like the beginning of a new commercial for a grocery or health store, but I assure you that it isn't. Nor is it a plug for the Capital One credit card. This line is the beginning of a simple reflection on our practice in churches (both Catholic and Christian) to pass the collection basket throughout the congregation during the offertory part of the service. No, I am not going to make a statement on the 'what' that is offered by the young and not so young, but on the fact that no one ever thinks of taking anything out of the collection basket, because what we put in is considered 'an offering.' Perhaps what we do in passing the basket should operate in our own lives, too. You see, as human beings, each of us 'passes our basket' to others throughout our lives.

Each day we symbolically 'pass the basket' in the conversations, interactions, activities, and relationships we have with others. Each day you and I reach into the pockets or wallets of our gifts and talents to help those around us. Through a smile, a kind word, a listening ear, a gentle gesture, some sage advice, or whatever may be needed at the moment to make someone's life better, we place an offering in another's basket. That simple solitary act of sharing has far reaching effects for those with whom we interact.

When I tried explaining this concept to my First Communicants as we discussed the parables that underlie the Eucharist, one of them commented, "Sister, that's just like the loaves and fishes." "How so?" I asked. "Well, Jesus took a little bit of food and when the Apostles passed it out, it became a lot of food!" (And I thought they didn't listen!) What amazed me was this child's ability to see that the miracle was Jesus' multiplication of the loaves and fishes through what the Apostles put into the baskets they used. And when you consider this miracle, five loaves and two fish fed not only the multitude at the event but also yielded leftovers to be shared with others as well.

God is never stingy! The offerings we place in other people's baskets come back to us in many ways. Sometimes what we give in emotional support strengthens us in our own dealings with others or helps us to see a similar personal situation in a better light. Frequently, the sacrifice we make to add a bit more to someone's basket is multiplied in our own basket as well. The 'bread' we offer may not be cast on the water, but it often returns in one or another way to enrich our own 'table.' The Lord habitually reminds us through varied parables that our gifts and talents are on loan and if we bury them in the ground or do nothing with them, they truly are wasted.

Frequently folks ask, 'what will I get out of it?' when the real question should be, 'what can I contribute to improve this situation?' In the quiet of my up-coming silent eight-day directed retreat, I am going to sort through my 'basket' to clearly assess what I have to offer to others. Now, I don't expect you to be silent for that long , but do take some quiet time to discover the great talents and gifts you have to share. It will definitely make a difference for all those whom you encounter!
