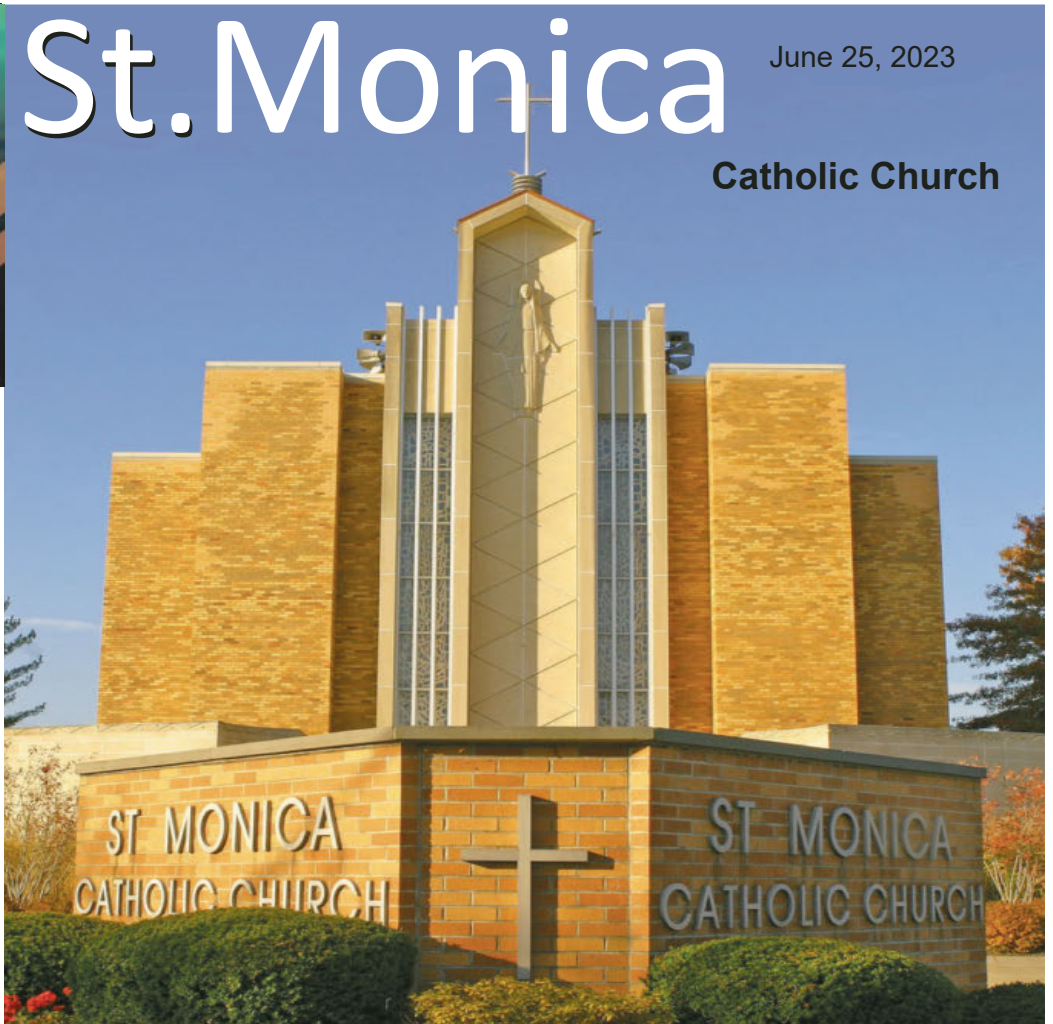

Pastoral Scene

Fr Dave Heney from the archdiocese of Los Angeles shared this story:

I remember years ago I had dinner with my father at a restaurant that we used to enjoy regularly but had not visited for a while. When we walked in, the manager looked up and said, "Welcome back! It is so good to see you again!" He then led us to a great table by a large window with a beautiful view outside. The waiter was especially helpful, and we had a delicious meal. (It helps to know the right person) On the way out, as I passed the manager, he looked up and said, "Come back soon, Fr. Murphy!" Well, Fr Heney was not as well-known as he thought. The prophet Jeremiah was.

Jeremiah is one of the key figures in the Old Testament. Considered a major prophet, he was born around 650 BC and died around 570 BC; his work was prior to and just after the Babylonian captivity

Look at the theme of his preaching- It certainly wasn't uplifting- predicting a great disaster of Israel- destruction of the temple.

And he is being denounced on every side. Jeremiah could have easily fallen into despair, thinking, God has duped me.

But just when you think he has given up- He proclaims: The Lord is with me; my persecutors will stumble; he has rescued the life of the poor."

It is good to immerse ourselves more fully into the Clarion call from Vatican II' every baptized person is Priest, Prophet, and King- Called to live and proclaim the truth- the Word of God- how challenging is that now?- Back in his day, it seems to be that many in society would have welcomed the message of Fulton Sheen, however, now, we are living through one of the most secularized time in history

Talk about God? - it could look a lot like terror on every side.

But we can't even fathom giving up- Embrace the prophet Jeremiah and how he overcame evil and terror- expressed the fire in your souls- recognize the source of all sweetness- Individual-ly and as a community, we can still say through the darkness that the Lord is with us like a mighty champion- We need prophets- The Universal Call to Holiness; follow the courage of Jeremiah

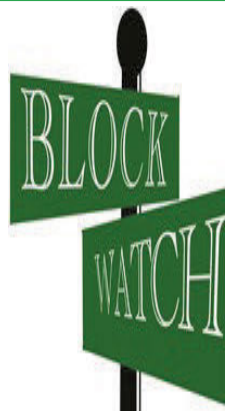
Peter's Pence Collection

Dietrich Bonhoeffer was killed in a Nazi concentration camp in 1945. A student and friend of Bonhoeffer's writes of a man who saw the execution:

"I saw Pastor Bonhoeffer... kneeling on the floor praying fervently to God. I was most deeply moved by the way this lovable man prayed, so devout and so certain that God heard his prayer. At the place of execution, he again said a short prayer and then climbed the few steps to the gallows, brave and composed. His death ensued

after a few seconds. In the almost fifty years that I worked as a doctor, I have hardly ever seen a man die so entirely submissive to the will of God.[55]

In his book, the *Cost of Discipleship*, Bonhoeffer reflects on Grace:

Cheap grace is the grace we bestow on ourselves. Cheap grace is the preaching of forgiveness without requiring repentance, baptism without church discipline, Communion without confession.... Cheap grace is grace without discipleship, grace without the cross, grace without Jesus Christ, living and incarnate.

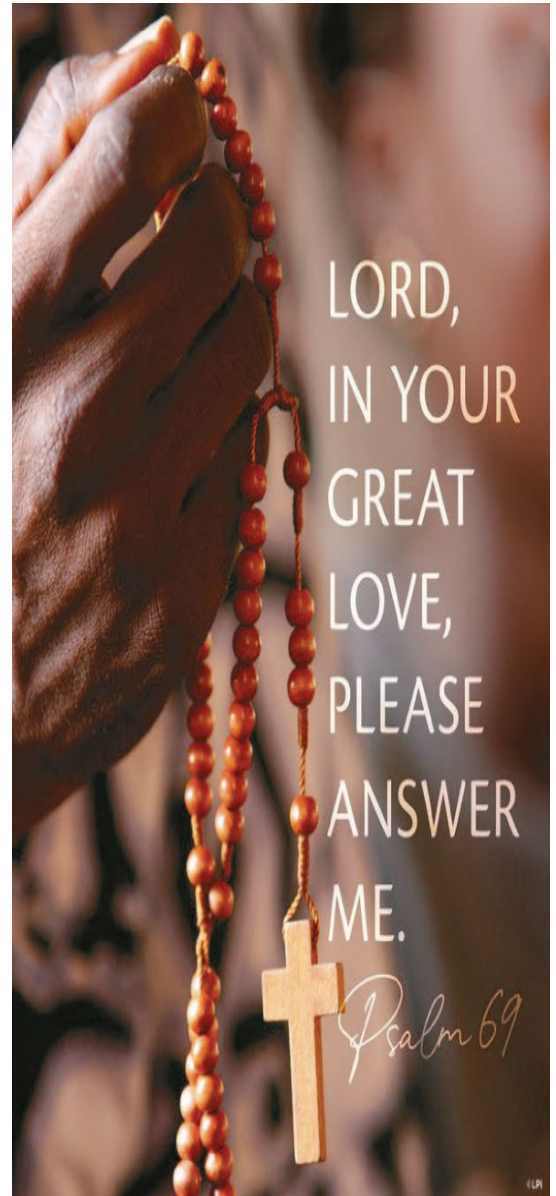
