Pastoral Scene

Dear Friends in Christ,

Keeping in mind that our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ is always present in the tabernacle and that each of us needs and desires to properly prepare our hearts for Him, I would ask that we all honor a more respectful silence in Church during the time preceding Mass. I especially have noticed when I am in the confessional on Saturday loud conversations that are disruptive to those trying to prepare their hearts for the

Holy Eucharist. Please save your conversations for outside the church.

A Beacon of Hope. As a parish we have seen through the statistics a decline in many facets; baptisms, weddings, weekly offertory, individuals preparing to enter the Church through RCIA, etc. This is what I call a Clarion call; an opportunity to ask God through prayer where He wants us to share our time, treasure and talents, to be a Beacon of Hope that draws more people to the message of Jesus Christ, which is so profoundly illumined in Matthew's Gospel: "You shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind. This is the greatest and the first commandment. **The second is like it: You shall love your neighbor as yourself.**"

I have shared numerous times one of my mentors, my late father Aloysius, and his witness to the Gospel. For many years in his retirement, he would get up early every Friday so he could attend Mass at St Malachi, then, he would stay and help distribute clothes to the marginalized, men and women who are homeless and not knowing where their next meal would come from. He also signed up for a weekly hour of Adoration at 2AM at St Raphael in Bay Village, a parish where he also served funerals. These are just a few examples of how my dad, and other mentors that he introduced to me shaped my journey.

So, as we enter this exciting journey, partnering with Our Sunday Visitor, every member of the community is called to prepare their hearts to let our Lord in, for it is through God that all things are possible.

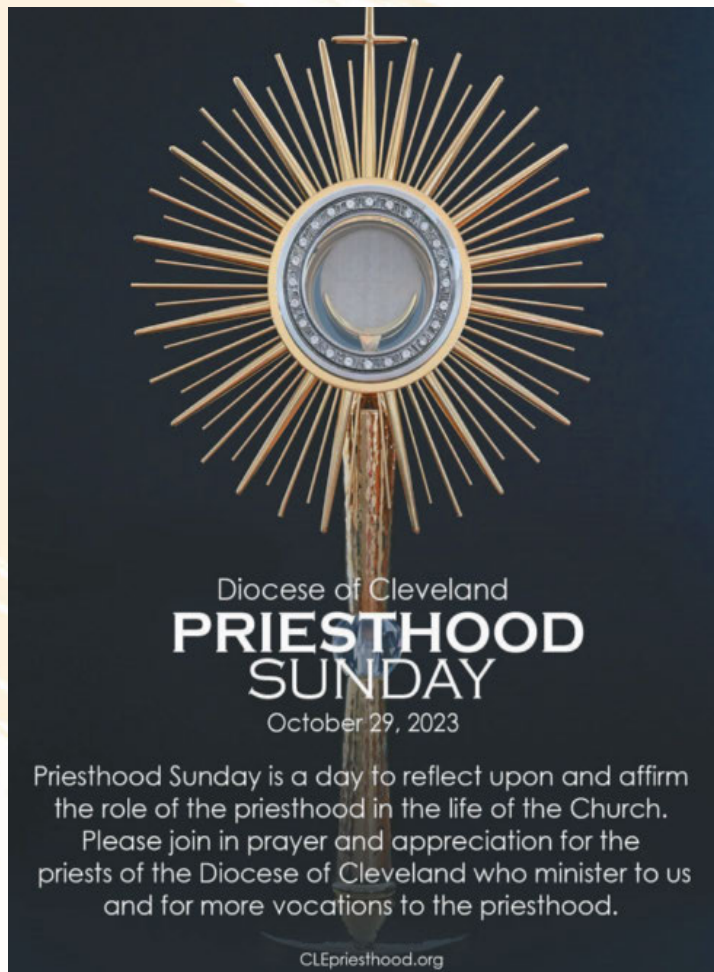

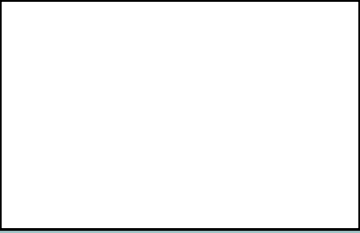
