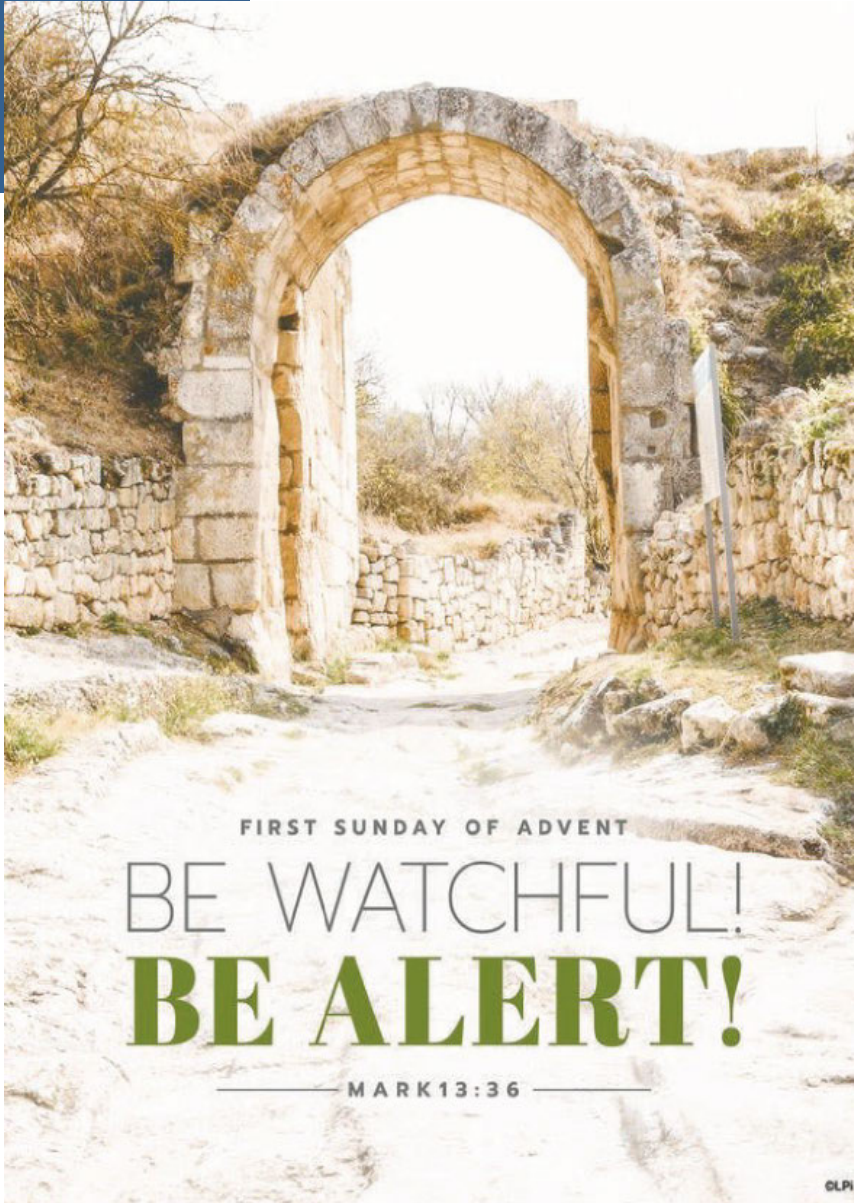

Pastoral Scene

Remembrance and Anticipation

As I write this Pastoral Scene, my radio is playing, “It’s beginning to look a lot like Christmas”, a lovely song, but not very supportive of the spirit of the Advent season which focuses on Remembrance and Anticipation. Please don’t label me as Scrooge, but there’s more to Advent than the commercial aspect of this season.

The word “Advent” is derived from the Latin word *adventus*, meaning “coming,” which translates to the Greek word *parousia*.

Originally, Advent was a season of preparation for the baptism of new Christians on the

January feast of Epiphany, the celebration of God’s incarnation represented by the visit of the Magi to the baby Jesus, his baptism in the Jordan River by John the Baptist, and his first miracle at Cana. During this season of preparation, Christians would spend 40 days in penance, prayer, and fasting to prepare for this celebration.

By the 6th century, however, Roman Christians had tied Advent to the coming of Christ, but the “coming” they had in mind was not Christ’s first coming in the manger in Bethlehem, but his second coming in the clouds as the judge of the world. The Advent season was not explicitly linked to Christ’s first coming at Christmas until the Middle Ages. Advent symbolizes the church’s present situation in these “last days” as God’s people waited for the return of Christ in glory to consummate his eternal kingdom.

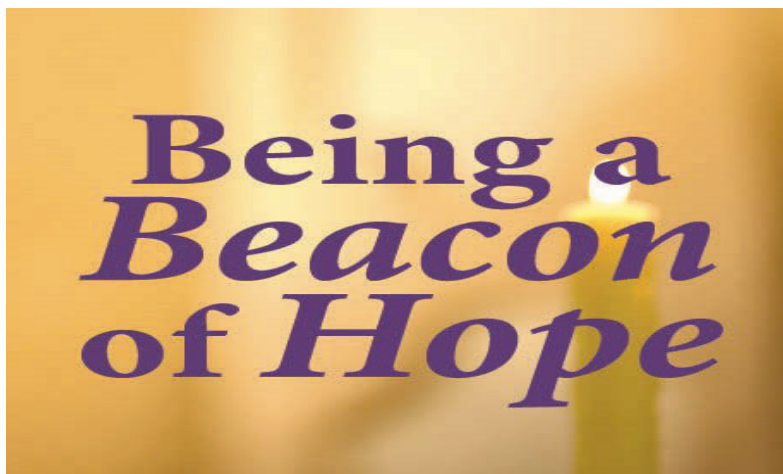
Advent places the Church in a similar situation to Israel at the end of the Old Testament: in exile, waiting and hoping in prayerful expectation for the coming of the Messiah. Israel looked back to God’s past gracious actions on their behalf in leading them out of Egypt in the Exodus, and called for God once again to act for them. In the same way, the church, during Advent, looks back upon Christ’s coming in celebration while at the same time looking forward in eager anticipation to the coming of Christ’s kingdom when he returns for his people.

To balance the two elements of remembrance and anticipation, look to the readings on the four weeks of Advent. ***The first two Sundays in Advent look forward to Christ’s second coming, and the last two Sundays look backward to remember Christ’s first coming.*** Over the course of the four weeks, Scripture readings move from passages about Christ’s return in judgment, to Old Testament passages about the expectation of the coming Messiah to New Testament passages about the announcements of Christ’s arrival by John the Baptist and the Angels.

Please enjoy the Advent journey to Christmas. It is the journey we take in Faith each year with all those who have gone before us.

O Come, Emanuel!

Waiting to be opened, to reveal Your love to me.

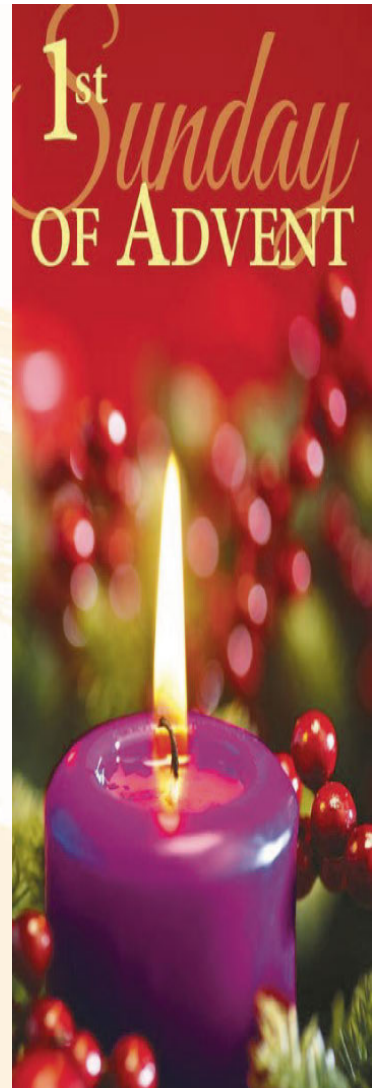
Restore to me the wonder that came with Jesus' birth,

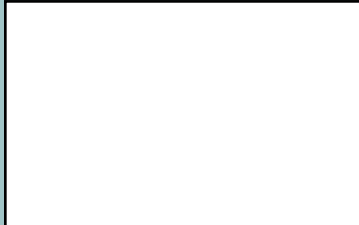

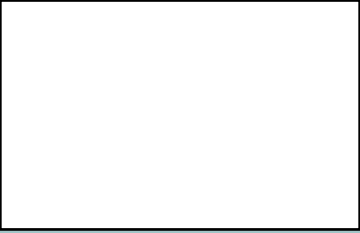
